

#### **Uniform Changes 2015**

The consultation process for the review of our school uniform is now complete. The forum held last week provided an opportunity for members of the community to view styles, discuss thoughts and make considered judgements. Thank you to everyone who showed support by attending. Those who were unable to attend put forward their opinions via the online survey (closed at 10pm Thursday) or completion of the paper survey at the office. More than 25% of families voted and they were overwhelmingly positive to changes. All votes and comments were recorded and the committee met to make future directions in accordance with DEC policy. Results to the four survey questions were as follows:

The tartan skort and skirt will be introduced for the girls and a unisex sports uniform made available for those who choose (not compulsory). A uniform company will be contracted to supply uniforms through a shop to be opened in the residence from next year and will include a selection of second hand uniforms. It will take some time for the new uniform changes to become the majority (estimated 2-3 years) and certainly no urgency. Prices are comparable to our current uniform prices and the tartan skort and skirt are far cheaper than any other local school however any families in difficult circumstances and requiring support are asked to make contact for student assistance. The uniform and prices will be available on the website and sent out to students later this week.

Thank you to our P&C and School Council who have been instrumental in overseeing the community consultation process and to the representatives voted in by these organisations that were members of the steering committee.

#### Resource Allocation Model (RAM) funding for 2015

On 20 November the Minister for Education Adrian Piccoli announced the next stage of the RAM process. Under this next stage schools will receive funding for all four equity loadings. The socio-economic background and the Aboriginal background equity loadings first delivered in 2014 will be supplemented by new equity loadings for English language proficiency and Low level adjustment for disability. Our school has been advised that we will receive \$294,000 RAM funding to support our students with additional learning needs in 2015. The school Executive will be working with our school community to determine the best ways to use these resources to support student learning.

# Student Safety Around Staff Carpark & Roads


