Dogs on school grounds

Section 14 of the *Companion Animals Act* (1998) prohibits dogs on school grounds except where the principal gives permission. Dogs must be kept on a leash in school grounds. Any dog that has been declared dangerous under section 33 of the *Companion Animals Act* must not be allowed on school grounds. Local councils retain this information.

Kindergarten Aquarium Excursion:

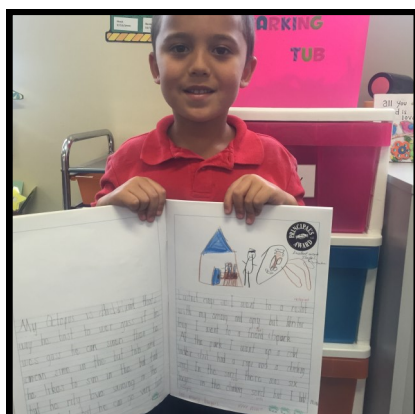
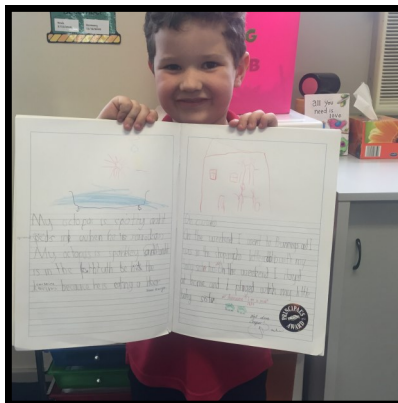
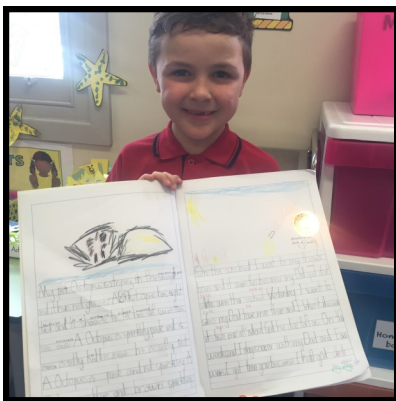

My experience at the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Football Foundation Camp – Laine Harrison 5W

It was my first time going to the soccer camp in Sydney, NSW. There were 22 people there from across Australia with a disability, there was 16 boys and 6 girls. I went with my mum and dad. We did a lot of training that involved swimming, futsal, indoor hockey, dancing/gymnastics and soccer. I met a lot of trainers. One was Chris Pyne, he used to play for the Australian disabled team. He taught us step overs, juggling, dribbling and scoring a goal. We trained all weekend to get ready for the final game. We tied 4-4, it was an interesting game. People had to nominate the best and fairest girl and the best and fairest boy, I won the trophy. It was a really fun experience at the camp, I made new friends and you might see me in the Paralympics in a few years!

Congratulations to Georgia Chapple on her efforts at the NSW PSSA Athletics Carnival on October 14. Competing in the 11 years girls Shot Put, Georgia was up against the very best in all of NSW. Whilst she placed in the 30s, she can be very proud of making it to a State Carnival.

Lake Macquarie Southern Beaches Rugby 7s

On Friday October 16, Edgeworth PS competed in the Lake Macquarie Southern Beaches Rugby 7s at Gateshead, looking to defend the title we won in 2014. Edgeworth entered 2 teams on the day, which were placed in opposing pools. Edgeworth A started the day with a 45-0 win over St Josephs B and a 40-5 win over Valentine PS B, before meeting a very skilled Belmont Christian College. In the most physically dominating performance I have seen by a primary school age team, Edgeworth completely overwhelmed BCC 15-5, seeing them top Pool A.

Edgeworth B began with an excellent victory over St Josephs A 30-10, before playing extremely well to beat Valentine A 10-5, which saw them top Pool B.

In the semi-finals, Edgeworth B came up against Belmont Christian College, and were unfortunately outclassed 0-25, whilst Edgeworth A cruised past St Josephs A 25-5. In the play off for 3rd, Edgeworth B ran out of steam against a combined St Josephs team, going down 0-30.

Edgeworth A faced a rematch against BCC in the final. Again Edgeworth controlled the game, however only went to halftime locked at 5-5. The second half was the same as the first, with Edgeworth all over BCC, however just couldn't land the knockout blow, despite Beau being controversially denied a try. In a dramatic finish, with only 5 seconds left on the clock, Georgia took an intercept to score the winning try and allowing Edgeworth PS to retain their title.

This concluded the teams rugby league and rugby union commitments for the year, which was again very successful, highlighted by winning the Paul Harragon Cup, Zone Rugby 7s, Lake Macquarie 7s and Wests Region Jarrod Mullen Cup. The vast majority of the team is in Year 4 and 5, which bodes very well for an exciting 2016. The boys and girls are to be congratulated on the way they played throughout the year, and the improvement in all of them has been immense. I need to thank all of the wonderful parents who come and support the team, and in particular Matthew Coverdale, Ashley Cox and Peter Douglas who have helped run water and warm ups at different times throughout the year, and to Cristy Coverdale, Bek Douglas, Andrea Hodges, Angela Smith and Nicole Chapple who have taken photos.

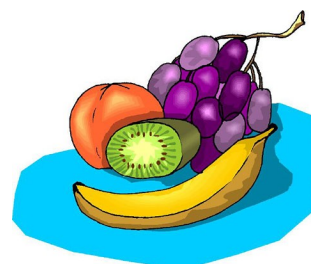

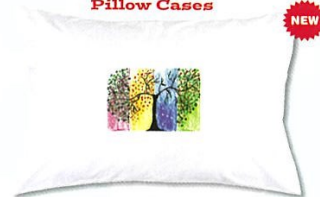
