For Semester 2 you will be informed of your child's progress, providing you with a grade and a ranking for application across all Key Learning Areas, as well as a comment for English, Mathematics and a general comment.

Recently, Sophie & Charlotte Barlow travelled to the South Pacific for a family cruise. Before leaving Edgeworth Public School gave many school items to be donated to a school just a boat ride away from Mystery Island. Donated items were: Scissors, exercise books, home reading books and water colour paints. Sophie and Charlotte bought lead pencils to add to the collection.

The school is Anelcauchat Primary with 170 students. The Principal at Anelcauchat is Ben, he was born on the island. The next village is Umej, which is remote and a 3 hour walk, they have approximately 50 students. The other school is Port Patrick and it has approximately 50 students, this school is also remote and an 8 hour walk from the main school Anelcauchat. Umej and Port Patrick Schools are so remote they have no power, no roads, cars or phones.

The school was closed for the summer holidays the day the girls went, so we organised with the cruise ship to deliver the books to Anelcauchat primary.

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Bark Building Reading Confidence for Kids



Dogs are great listeners! Children enjoy an environment of unconditional acceptance and emotional support. Our animal assisted reading program removes stress and peer pressure for the reluctant reader and BaRK makes reading fun.

What is BaRK and where is it

offered? BaRK is a free eight-week program run during school

terms, that allows children to practice reacting on a ne-to-one basis to a trained therapy dog. Each session

is fifteen minutes. Families must commit to the full eight-week program. The dog's trainer will sit near-by to assist the child if needed. BaRK is available at various Lake Mac Libraries. Please contact 4945 2452 for more details.

How does BaRK encourage reluctant

readers to read? A bond is encouraged between child and dog by having the same child read to the same dog each week. The dog allows children to gain confidence and self esteem by providing his/her love and attention in an atmosphere free of criticism. The dogs in the BaRK program love to listen. Such an environment allows children to feel less self-conscious because dogs don't worry if a child stutters or mispronounces a word.



What type of students? The BaRK program is beneficial to all children struggling with their reading. This confidence building program also benefits children who lack self esteem or who are shy. Any primary aged children experiencing difficulty in reading may be nominated for the program by a teacher or parent. **Bark Dogs are trained by Delta Society** Bark dogs are trained through the Delta Therapy Dogs Program. This program involves temperament testing of dogs and training the volunteers to become pet partner teams. Volunteers and their Delta Therapy Dogs also visit hospitals and nursing homes. The dog trainer will also have completed a working with children check.
